# NATIONAL WORKSHOP

organized in the framework of the project "NELLIP – Network of European Language Labeled Initiatives and Projects"

# 11 MARCH 2014

SOFIA, BULGARIA

# 1) Information

The second NELLIP national workshop was organized on **11 March 2014 in Sofia, Bulgaria** (rented meeting hall). The preparatory work before the workshop included distributing information on the project to relevant organizations active in the field of language learning and making reference to the project website, the developed databases and documents. 26 people signed up for the workshop, 22 of them attended. Invitations and event programmes were distributed online and on print well in advance through email, associated partners, relevant events, etc.

A representative from the National Agency was invited but could not attend the event.

# 6) Conclusions

The workshop was very successful. It gathered organisations from various fields of activity and grounds for cooperation were established.

The participants found the NELLIP findings extremely useful and highly appreciated the information provided on the ELL initiative. The ELL award is still not that popular in Bulgaria and for some of the participants the information received was completely new.

The discussions and group work on quality issues were extremely interesting and resulted in a brainstorming session on tools for management and quality assurance.

The 2 online meetings gave an overview of the workshops in other countries and were a good forum for exchanging ideas on quality, innovation and networking.

The participants highly appreciated the developed Guidelines and evaluated them as useful, practical and applicable for the development of high quality language projects and initiatives.

# 7) Minutes of the workshops

- 1. Opening words and explanation of the objectives of the workshop
- 2. The participants were presented with the ELL initiative since not all of them were familiar with the award in details. Discussions and recommendations were directed towards making the ELL more visible and providing information about the procedure and deadlines well in advance and not only on the NA website. Recommendation for continuing with the update of the NELLIP database on ELL projects was made.
- 3. The NELLIP project was presented and the participants were introduced to all developed products through the online portal of the project. Some of the good practices were discussed in detail. Discussions were open on different types of language initiatives and possible collaboration opportunities mainly related to ICT. A few participants presented their current language projects and initiated discussions on innovative approached for language learning and what methods for language learning are currently available on the market. An improvised presentation of an online learning tool for the blind was made.
- 4. Coffee break
- 5. Group work on shared definitions of quality in language teaching and learning. The work was based on an adapted version of the worksheets provided by Richard Rossner from EAQUALS. The group work resulted in a discussion on quality issues related to the link "service-client-quality" extracting the main ideas of each group on a flipchart. As a follow-up the participants brainstormed on connecting their findings with the most important aspects of a quality project.
- 6. Individual work on the topic "Tools for management and quality assurance" followed by discussions and summary of the main factors with reference to existing good practices for language learning promoted by the participants
- 7. Presentation of the NELLIP Guidelines with reference to the quality issues discussed in the previous sessions. The Guidelines were of a specific interest to the participants and a lot of questions on different sections were asked and addressed.
- 8. Work on the Improvement Plans. Three working groups were formed the 1<sup>st</sup> of them undertook the improvement of an existing initiative, the 2<sup>nd</sup> one developed a strategy for submitting a completed project for the ELL award and the 3<sup>rd</sup> one developed an idea for a new initiative.

- 10. Work on the Improvement Plans continued.
- 11. Online transnational meeting with participants in the workshop in Sweden. Both sides presented the results of their discussions on quality, innovation and networking. The meeting was quite useful and gave an idea of what is done in Sweden.
- 12. Online transnational meeting with participants in the workshop in Romania. Both sides presented the development of their workshops. Ideas on language learning initiatives were presented. The meeting was quite useful.
- 13. Presentation of the results from the work groups on the Improvement Plans. Discussions on the presented ideas and feedback from the other groups.
- 14. Evaluation of the workshop and the NELLIP online portal.
- 15. Discussions on collaboration models and common interests in terms of language projects continued informally.
- 16. Closing of the event and announcing the next national workshop 11 April 2014.

### 8) Evaluation Report
