III. Multilingualism and the development of language competences through educational projects

The NELLIP Project, Platform and Guidelines – interactive presentation by Irina David, *PROSPER-ASE Language Centre*.

V. Practical session – outlining a new project in the field of language education using the NELLIP

Guidelines - moderated by Laura Muresan, Liliana Dellevoet and Roxana Barlea, *PROSPER-ASE Language Centre*

1. The participants used the worksheets prepared for the sessions and studied the short version of the Guidelines (previously translated into Romanian). There were discussions about innovation in language learning and the ELL priority areas for 2014. It was decided to focus on a project in the language skills development area.



2. Brainstorming of ideas for a new project proposal. The participants followed the grid included in the worksheets and agreed on draft structure of a project proposal in adult education having as a target group young adults enrolled in tertiary education in Romania.

VI. Skype connection with the NELLIP Workshop taking place simultaneously in Finland, organised by ONMIA (NELLIP project partner institution).

One representative of each organisation introduced the participants in the workshops and briefly outlined the contents of the discussions and their outcome.

VII. Conclusions

The attendees assessed the overall activities of the workshop and filled in evaluation questionnaires
