
Necessary elements of language projects aimed at those participants that are not language practitioners.

Conclusions


- Irish language linked to Irish identity and culture
- Importance of language learning for commercial and business purposes as well as a way to discourage ethnocentrism and enhance social cohesion
- Plurilingual students more open to other cultures, more respectful of diversity and better understanding of different ways of thinking
- Language learning linked to business, culture and corporate responsibility
- ► ICT support fundamental for projects





Needs

- Inclusion and equality should be fostered in schools
- Need to focus on a practical approach when teaching languages as opposed to the theoretical perspective used in the past
- Need for primary teachers to be trained in language teaching
- Language learning should be part of university degrees not related to languages
- Innovation and quality should be encouraged in schools
- A reward system in place is needed as well as proper monitoring structures, resources and recognition for teachers





Challenges

- Lack of Irish speaker teachers
- Lack of resources in schools
- EU projects require high demands and resources
- Teachers need to be supported and trained
- Current situation of Plurilingual workers in call centres not an incentive
- English deemed to be enough (students in Ireland not encouraged to learn other languages and therefore in clear disadvantage in relation to EU jobs)





Evaluation (1)

- NELLIP provided a framework to share knowledge and developments of all ELL winners
- Opportunity to interact and network. Sharing good practices and experience
- Opportunity to develop and become involved in projects
- Workshops well structured with diverse perspectives. The session built on the previous workshops and the confirmation that there is scope for much more
- Possibilities to make connections across different projects and initiatives presented at outset very inspiring to hear about the breadth of diversity
