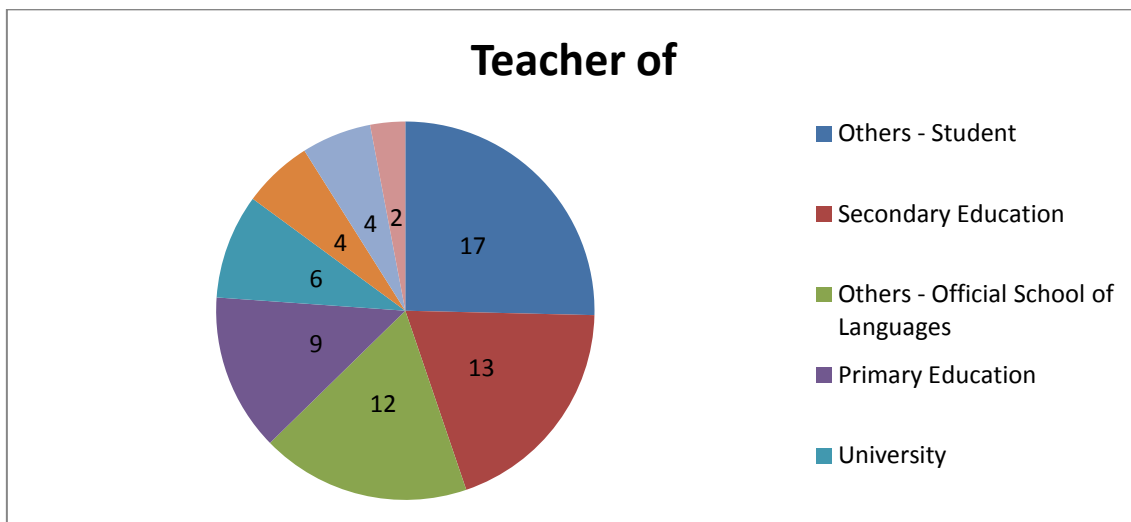




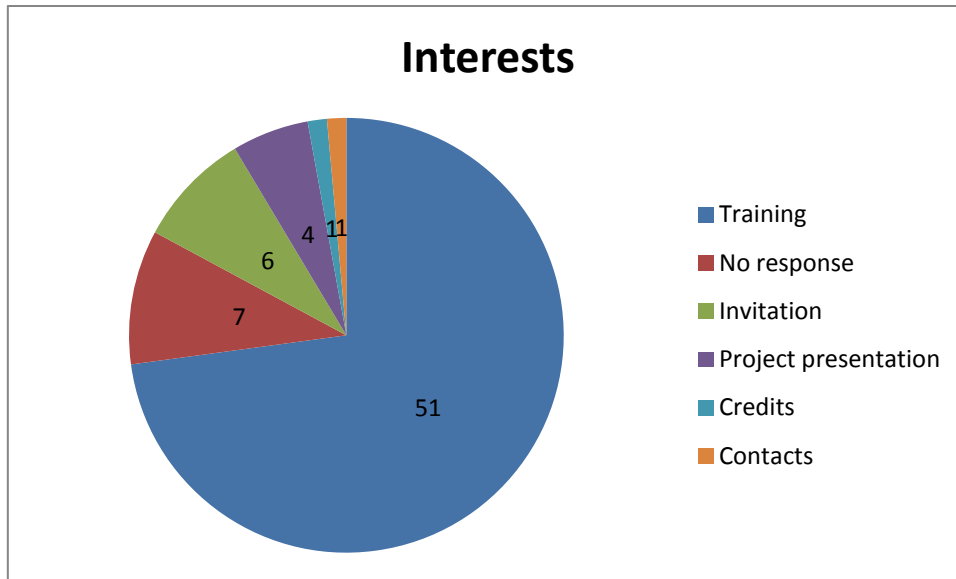
Report: evaluation Nellip Workshop

The present report informs about the participants' evaluation of the Nellip Project Workshop, which took place in the Teacher Training College, in Cáceres, on 14th February 2014 and was organized by GexCALL research group (University of Extremadura).

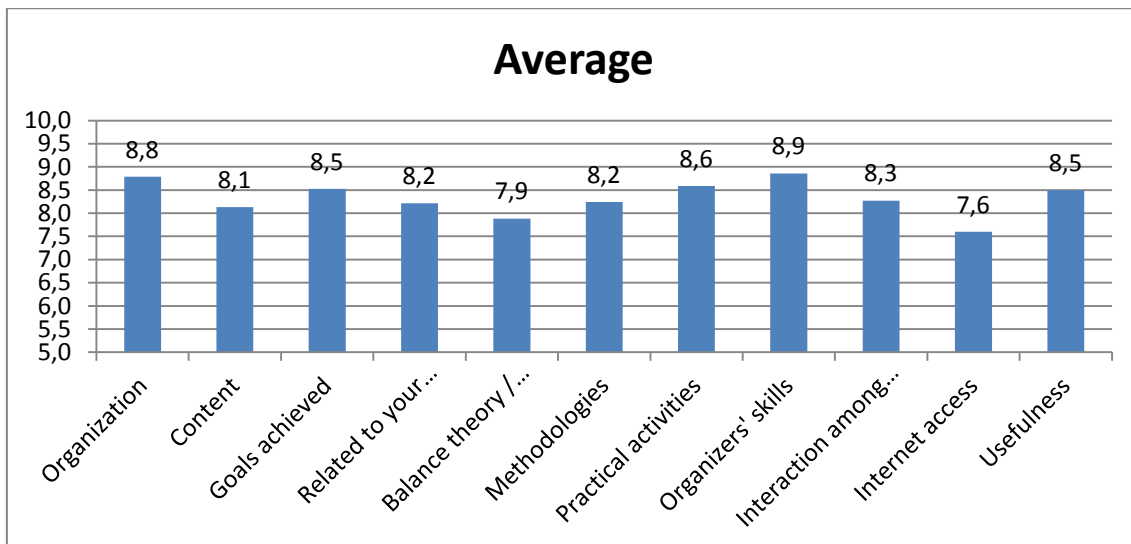
Participants were mainly BA in Preschool and School Teacher Training students (17), Secondary School (12) and Official Language School teachers (17). These were followed by Primary School (9) or University teachers (6) and attendees from a minority of sectors such as Adult Education or Vocational Training. With respect to their specialty, a large majority teaches or studies English (34). A smaller group belonged to Teacher Training for Preschool (8) and Primary School (6), or other languages like French (6) and Portuguese (3).



When asked for their interest in the event, most of them stated that training was the main reason for participating (51). Other responses like invitations, project presentation, ECTS credits or contacts are not as noticeable.



Participants were also asked to assess different aspects of the workshop and give a score in a scale from 0 to 10. Final average score ranges from 7.6 to 8.9. The most valued characteristic was the organizers' skills, closely followed by the general organization. Practical activities were highly valued (8.6), as well as the usefulness and goals achieved (8.5), which seem to be mostly related to their expectations (8.2).



In the questionnaire, there was room for comments, which give evidence of the workshop success in terms of organization, planning and coordination, opportunities for interaction, participation and making contacts, presentation of awarded projects and the interdisciplinary nature of the different sections.
