II. Introductory steps:

- Welcome address from Laura Muresan, President of the PROSPER-ASE Language Centre Association
- Introduction of the workshop's themes and main objectives presented by Liliana Dellevoet, *PROSPER-ASE Language Centre*
- **III. Update regarding the European Language Label in Romania and the Erasmus+ programme** short presentation given by Ms Ileana Racoviceanu, in charge with the ELL at the Romanian National Agency ANPCDEPF, followed by questions from the participants and discussions

IV. NELLIP Project Presentation

The NELLIP Project, Platform and Guidelines – interactive presentation by Lucia Grosu, *PROSPER-ASE Language Centre*.

- V. Practical session outlining a new project in the field of adult education using the NELLIP Guidelines moderated by Liliana Dellevoet and Roxana Barlea, PROSPER-ASE Language Centre
- 1. The participants used the worksheets prepared for the sessions and studied the short version of the Guidelines (previously translated into Romanian). There were discussions about innovation in language learning and the ELL priority areas for 2014. It was decided to focus on a project in the area of Social Inclusion.





- 2. Brainstorming of ideas for a new project proposal. The participants followed the grid included in the worksheets and agreed on draft structure of a project proposal in adult education having as a target group young adults in rural areas in Romania.
- VI. Skype connection with the NELLIP Workshop taking place simultanously in Vilnius, Lithuania, organised by Public Service Language Centre.

One representative of each organisation introduced the participants in the workshops and briefly outlined the contents of the discussions and their outcome. In both countries the participants focused on adult education and on a new project proposal in the field of Social inclusion.

Both parties agreed to continue the discussion and to form a partnership for applying together for a new language project.

VII. Conclusions

The attendees assessed the overall activities of the workshop and filled in evaluation questionnaires

The participants exchanged opinions and some of them joined the Facebook NELLIP group

It was decided to organise a follow-up meeting to discuss further and refine the new poject proposal.
